 - C. Fairmount Pines families of 7 or 8 will only be accepted the only choice in the city of Davenport, IA
- xiv. Refugee Garden in Chicago (Annisa offered connection) sell and go to farmers market

- xv. Intensive, personal, individualized assistance stabilizing families so they may thrive take care of basic needs
- xvi. LIMITATIONS: able to take on some, now that some clients are taken care of one more person could fill the spot
 - B. Focus on women; as they experience more barriers
 - C. Opportunity for education (not even HS) and driving are much lower
 - D. High vulnerability as a criteria
 - E. Mostly East Africa; Congo, Burundi Swahili speaking countries
 - F. Diversity VISA- nearly died, has two kids (green card lottery and you pay for everything, no refugee system support)
 - G. Clients tend to stay inside a lot, but are somewhat connected with communities after acclimate
